## Seniors

- All group activities and community meals have been canceled at the Citizen's Center.
- The offices of the Council on Aging, Recreation Department, and Veterans Department, housed in the Citizen's Center, are open by appointment and by phone: (978) 374-2390.
- Meals on Wheels is still delivering meals.
- Northern Essex Elderly Transportation (NEET) program is still running.
- SHINE program for medicare is still available by phone. The team is working remotely and checking the voicemail box frequently. Please leave a message and a worker will call you back.
- Nursing homes cannot accept visitors at this time, with the exception of hospice. Please call your individual facility if you have specific questions about visitation policies.
- On Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, Market Basket stores will be open only to those 60 years and older from 5:30 am to 7:00 am.

Prepackaged bags of food may then be picked up at the next door. We are accepting new participants.
- The Salvation Army is doing a modified food pantry service with pre-packed boxes on Mon-Wed-Fri mornings from 9:30-11 am. New clients are welcome. They are serving bag lunches on Tues-Thurs-Fri at noon in place of the regular meal service.

How to access support for your local business or non-profit:

- Small Business Administration Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) Program
  - The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is offering low-interest federal disaster loans for working capital to Massachusetts small businesses suffering substantial economic injury as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19).
  - Applicants may apply online, receive additional disaster assistance information and download applications at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.
  - Applicants may also call SBA's Customer Service Center at (800) 659-2955 or email [disastercustomerservice@sba.gov](mailto:disastercustomerservice@sba.gov) for more information on SBA disaster assistance.
  - Completed applications should be mailed to U.S. Small Business Administration, Processing and Disbursement Center, 14925 Kingsport Road, Fort Worth, TX 76155.
  - The deadline to apply for an Economic Injury Disaster Loan is **Dec. 18, 2020**
- Small Business Loan Fund: \$10 Million was announced for small business loans up to \$75,000. Small businesses with fewer than 50 employees can apply for a Small Business Loan here: <https://www.empoweringsmallbusiness.org/>
- The Department of Revenue is in the process of rolling out regulations that will allow small businesses to defer their sales, meals, and occupancy taxes for March, April, and May and instead make the payment by June 20, 2020.

*Federal Level:*

- For small businesses & nonprofits: if you have been impacted by COVID19, the U.S. Small Business Administration is offering loans through funding provided by the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act that was recently passed by Congress and signed into law by the President.

## **Taxes**

Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin announced that taxpayers will have an additional 90 days to pay their federal income taxes — but you still must file your taxes by the April 15 deadline. You can file for an extension, though that must also be completed by April 15. If you owe taxes: This is good news, as you'll have more time to pay. If you're due a refund: It's business as usual.
